MTS Training Pathways


The MTS Apprentices Pathways

At MTS we think that a ministry training pathway that combines hands-on ministry experience with formal theological education is a great way to train for a lifetime of Gospel ministry.

There are two routes you can take:

1. You can follow a **TEAM LEADER** pathway, which involves going to Theological College after your apprenticeship.
2. Alternatively, you can follow the **TEAM MEMBER** pathway, where you complete a 2 year or 3 year Apprenticeship, combining hands-on ministry training with part-time theological study. Upon completion you will be ready to be involved in ministry on a full-time basis as a valued Team Member.

All pathways provide you with the opportunity to spend 2 or more years in a hands-on ministry apprenticeship – living the life of a full-time Gospel Worker.



The MTS curriculum is designed to help you discover how you are wired and in what way you might best contribute to growing God's Kingdom in the future.

Completing an MTS Apprenticeship is a great way to work out your suitability for ministry work in the future.

MTS Scholarships

Many churches and other ministries sponsor scholarships to enable students to complete an MTS pathway. All persons seeking to undertake an MTS Apprenticeship are encouraged to apply for an "MTS Scholarship" to support them on their journey.



What being an apprentice involves

"If a person wants to be a farmer long term, they don't start off at Agricultural College as a first port of call. They need to head off first to a farm and work alongside an experienced farmer for a couple of years. They need to live through a couple of cycles of the seasons. They need to know what it is like to deliver lambs in the middle of the night, harvest the grain before it is destroyed by rain and grapple with the blurred boundaries between work and rest."

The MTS Team Leader Apprenticeship

Being an MTS Team Leader Apprentice involves a two year program based within a church or a specialist ministry team. You will learn through active participation in evangelism and Bible teaching, all under the leadership of a trainer.

MTS Apprentices would normally be immersed in the activities of their church or ministry. MTS has developed an apprentice curriculum which has both compulsory and optional elements. It is a flexible course that can be adapted to the apprentice's context. This certificate course from the Australian College of Theology (ASTC – Academic Studies in Theology Certificate) is recognised by and eligible for Austudy.

You will be required to complete the MTS Apprentice curriculum over the two years.

The Academic Studies in Theology Certificate (ASTC) is undertaken through the Timothy Partnership, and is accredited with the Australian College of Theology (ACTh).

MTS Scholars do a 37.5 hour (per week) placement in a church or ministry. The MTS curriculum is 12 hours (1.5 days) of that 37.5 hour (5 day) week. The Timothy Partnership Certificate in Academic Studies (Theology) takes up one third of the MTS curriculum.

The MTS Team Member Apprenticeship

The MTS Team Member Apprenticeship is a two-year program combining theological study with active participation in evangelism and Bible teaching, all under the leadership of a trainer. You will do a maximum of 2.5 days theological study, which leaves you free to be immersed in practical ministry activities through the remainder of your week.

MTS Apprenticeship Week at a Glance

This is a typical week for a Team Leader ministry apprentice training in larger church. Please note the mix of study/training and hands-on ministry experience opportunities. As one of the objectives of MTS is to enable an apprentice to experience life 'as a full-time Gospel worker' this typical week has been structured to replicate the hours a committed lay church member (who works full-time) would spend at work and at church, ie. 5 regular working days plus 1–2 nights and also Sunday.

Is an MTS Apprenticeship really a Cadetship?

Trainer FAQ

Who is an MTS trainer?

“What you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also.”

2 Timothy 2:2

MTS Trainers are Christian leaders who take on ministry apprentices for a set period – normally two years. The biblical paradigm for ministry training is spiritual parenthood. Jesus called the 12 disciples his “children” (John 13:33). Paul called Timothy “my dear son” (2 Tim 1:2). This language is not accidental. Indeed, all Christians are encouraged to call God “our Father” when praying (Matthew 6:9).

Therefore, an MTS Trainer is a spiritual father. Like any father, their job is to mould, shape, correct, encourage and instruct their child – the MTS Apprentice.

“It is one way to ensure we are being responsible and raising up the next generation to be able to guard the gospel, preach the gospel and live out the gospel.”
